A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Charles County - New School Capacity Construction Bonds - Limitation**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain limitation on the amount the Charles County
4 Commissioners may borrow by issuing certain bonds; and generally relating to
5 the issuance of certain bonds by the Charles County Commissioners.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article 66B - Land Use**

20 (f) (1) (i) In this subsection the following words have the meanings
21 indicated.

22 (ii) 1. "All county costs" means the total costs incurred to
23 construct new capacity for public school facilities in the county, including costs for:

24 A. Land acquisition;

25 B. Architectural and engineering design;

- 1 C. Infrastructure;
- 2 D. New classrooms;
- 3 E. Equipment;
- 4 F. Interest on bond principal; and
- 5 G. Bond issuance.

6 2. "All county costs" includes the total square footage of new
7 public school facilities multiplied by the State square foot construction allowance,
8 minus the State funding share.

9 (iii) "Dwelling type" means single family detached home, town
10 house, or multifamily housing unit.

11 (iv) "New residential development" means the development of land
12 that results in the issuance of a use and occupancy permit for a residential dwelling
13 unit.

14 (v) "New school capacity construction bonds" means 10-year bonds
15 issued by the County Commissioners under this subsection.

16 (vi) "Public school facilities" means elementary, middle, and high
17 school facilities.

18 (vii) "Pupil generation rate" means the average number of students
19 in the county by dwelling type attending elementary, middle, and high school.

20 (2) (i) The County Commissioners may [borrow not more than
21 \$100,000,000 by issuing] ISSUE 10-year new school capacity construction bonds at
22 any time and from time to time on the full faith and credit of the county to fund all
23 county costs in providing new school capacity.

24 (ii) The new school capacity construction bonds shall constitute
25 securities:

26 1. In which all public officers, public bodies of the State and
27 its political subdivisions, all insurance companies, State banks and trust companies,
28 national banking associations, savings banks, savings and loan associations,
29 investment companies, executors, administrators, trustees, and other fiduciaries may
30 properly and legally invest funds including capital in their control or belonging to
31 them; and

32 2. Which may be properly and legally deposited with and
33 received by any State or county officer, any State agency, or political subdivision of
34 the State for any purpose for which the deposit of bonds or obligations of the State
35 may be authorized by law.

1 (iii) The issuance and sale of new school capacity construction bonds
2 under this subsection is exempt from the provisions of Article 31, §§ 9 through 11 of
3 the Code.

4 (iv) The transfer of, interest on, and any income derived from new
5 school capacity construction bonds shall be exempt from State and local taxation.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2005.
