A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Correctional Services - State Use Industries - Construction**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing State Use Industries to develop programs and
4 provide construction for State correctional facilities; exempting the programs
5 from certain provisions of law; prohibiting certain construction projects from
6 exceeding a certain amount; and generally relating to State Use Industries.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Correctional Services**

15 3-511.

16 (A) The Commissioner and General Manager may develop programs to provide
17 services or produce goods used by:

- 18 (1) units of State government;
- 19 (2) political subdivisions of the State;
- 20 (3) units of the federal government;
- 21 (4) units of other states; or
- 22 (5) political subdivisions of other states.

23 (B) (1) THE COMMISSIONER AND THE GENERAL MANAGER, WITH THE
24 APPROVAL OF THE SECRETARY, MAY DEVELOP PROGRAMS TO PROVIDE

1 CONSTRUCTION, AS DEFINED IN TITLE 11, SUBTITLE 1 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND
2 PROCUREMENT ARTICLE, FOR STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

3 (2) THE PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
4 SUBSECTION ARE NOT SUBJECT TO:

5 (I) THE PROVISIONS OF § 3-515 OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

6 (II) THE PROVISIONS OF DIVISION II OF THE STATE FINANCE AND
7 PROCUREMENT ARTICLE, EXCEPT FOR § 11-101 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND
8 PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

9 (3) A CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
10 SUBSECTION MAY NOT EXCEED \$500,000 IN TOTAL COSTS AS DETERMINED BY THE
11 SECRETARY.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2005.
