- 6 Office of Personal Assistance Services of the Department of Human Resources whose
- 7 positions are transferred to the Department of Disabilities by this Act shall be so
- 8 transferred on the effective date of this Act without any diminution of their rights,
- 9 benefits, or employment and retirement status.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all persons who are

- 11 classified employees of the Office of Personal Assistance Services of the Department
- 12 of Human Resources as of July 1, 2005, and who are transferred to the Department of
- 13 Disabilities as part of the transfer of the Attendant Care Program Office of Personal
- 14 Assistance Services shall be transferred without any diminution of their rights,
- 15 benefits, or employment status, including, if any, merit system and retirement status.

16 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That nothing in this Act shall

- 17 be construed to affect the funding, employees, or property of the Living at Home
- 18 Waiver, or any of the powers and duties of the Department of Health and Mental
- 19 Hygiene to administer the Living at Home: Maryland Community Choices Medicaid
- 20 Waiver.

21 <u>SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That except as otherwise</u>

- 22 provided in this Act, nothing in this Act affects the term of office of an appointed
- 23 member of any board, commission, committee, or council. A person who is a member of
- 24 such a unit on the effective date of this Act shall remain a member for the balance of
- 25 the term to which the person was appointed, unless the person before the end of the
- 26 term dies, resigns, or is removed pursuant to the provisions of law.

27 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all property, including

- 28 real or personal property, records, fixtures, appropriations, credits, assets, liabilities,
- 29 obligations, rights, and privileges held by the Office of Personal Assistance Services of
- 30 the Department of Human Resources to carry out the exclusive functions of the
- 31 Attendant Care Program transferred under this Act shall be transferred to the
- 32 <u>Department of Disabilities on the effective date of this Act.</u>

33 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise

- 34 provided by law, all existing laws, rules, and regulations, proposed rules and
- 35 regulations, standards and guidelines, policies, orders and other directives, forms,
- 36 plans, memberships, contracts, property, investigations, administrative and judicial
- 37 responsibilities, rights to sue and be sued, and all other duties and responsibilities
- 38 associated with the functions of the Office of Personal Assistance Services of the
- 39 Department of Human Resources and the Attendant Care Program transferred from
- 40 the Office of Personal Assistance Services prior to the effective date of this Act shall
- the office of Cisonal Assistance Services prior to the circums and the small
- 41 continue in effect under the Department of Disabilities, until completed, withdrawn,
- 42 canceled, modified, or otherwise changed pursuant to law.

- 1 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all contracts,
- 2 agreements, grants, or other obligations entered into by the Office of Personal Care
- 3 Assistance Services of the Department of Human Resources and the Attendant Care
- 4 Program transferred from the Office of Personal Care Assistance Services prior to
- 5 October 1, 2005, are hereby declared to be valid, legal, and binding obligations of the
- 6 Department of Disabilities, enforceable in accordance with their terms.
- 7 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publishers of the
- 8 Annotated Code of Maryland, subject to the approval of the Department of Legislative
- 9 Services, shall propose the correction of any agency names and titles throughout the
- 10 Annotated Code that are rendered incorrect by this Act and any necessary corrections
- 11 shall be satisfied by passage of the Annual Corrective Bill of 2006.
- 12 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all appropriations
- 13 including State and federal funds, held by the Office of Personal Assistance Services
- 14 to carry out the exclusive functions of the Attendant Care Program transferred under
- 15 this Act shall be transferred to the Department of Disabilities on the effective date of
- 16 this Act.
- 17 SECTION 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial
- 18 members of the Personal Assistance Services Advisory Committee shall expire as
- 19 follows:
- 20 (a) Three consumer members and two of the organizational or agency
- 21 members in 2008; and
- 22 (b) Three consumer members and three of the organizational or agency
- 23 members in 2009.
- 24 SECTION 14. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 25 July 1, 2005.
