HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 3

Blue Ribbon Panel Recommendations for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority

4 FOR the purpose of supporting the recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Panel on the 5 capital funding needs for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority.

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6 WHEREAS, The governors of Maryland and Virginia and the Mayor of the

7 District of Columbia have designated the National Capital Region Transportation

8 Planning Board (Board) as the metropolitan planning organization for the

9 Washington Metropolitan area; and

10 WHEREAS, In February 2004, the Board issued a report, Time to Act, that

11 concluded that a substantial increase in the federal, State, regional, and local funding

12 commitment is necessary to meet the capital funding needs of the Washington

13 Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA); and

14 WHEREAS, A number of entities, including the United States General

15 Accounting Office, the Brookings Institution, and the Northern Virginia

16 Transportation Authority, have documented the financial difficulties faced by

17 WMATA and have suggested an independent analysis of the need for and potential

 $18\;$ creation of one or more dedicated revenue sources for WMATA; and

19 WHEREAS, On September 8, 2004, the Metropolitan Washington Council of

20 Governments, the Greater Washington Board of Trade, and the Federal City Council

21 authorized the creation of a blue ribbon panel to verify and quantify the current and

22 future financial needs of WMATA, to identify and evaluate potential dedicated

23 revenue sources for WMATA, and to make the findings, conclusions, and

24 recommendations that the panel deems financially and legally workable and 25 appropriate; and

26 WHEREAS, Thirteen individuals with extensive knowledge and experience in

27 the areas of transit, economics, public finance, and political science were named to the 28 Panel on the Analysis of and Potential for Alternate Dedicated Revenue Sources for

28 Panel on the Analysis of and Potential for Alternate Dedicated Revenue Sources for 29 WMATA with a charge to review existing research and analyses, to develop its own

30 research, to investigate the pros and cons of selected alternative dedicated revenue

31 sources, and to report to the three sponsoring organizations on or about December 15,

32 2004; and

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1 WHEREAS, The panel was given independent professional staff, in addition to 2 the staff of the sponsoring organizations and WMATA, to assist the panel in meeting 3 its responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, The panel formally met seven times, communicated extensively on
a number of occasions between panel members and with staff, and sought public
comment twice, initially on the issues presented by the sponsoring organizations and
ultimately on the panel's draft report which was adopted on December 14, 2004; and

8 WHEREAS, The final report of the panel, issued on January 6, 2005, finds, 9 concludes, and recommends that: (1) Maryland, Virginia, and the District of Columbia 10 mutually implement a regional dedicated revenue source sufficient to address the 11 projected shortfall for WMATA capital maintenance and system enhancement; (2) the 12 preferable regional dedicated revenue source option is a regional sales tax or, if a 13 sales tax is not mutually acceptable to the three jurisdictions, other studied and 14 recommended options for consideration include a regional payroll tax or parallel 15 increases in property taxes; (3) farebox revenues should continue at the current 16 operating ratio of 57 percent; (4) the federal government should participate 17 significantly in addressing the shortfall for capital maintenance and system 18 enhancement; and (5) the federal, State, and local funding of paratransit, called 19 Metro Access, should be addressed separately from this financing effort; now,

20 therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
 General Assembly of Maryland supports the recommendations of the Blue Ribbon
 Panel; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Governor be urged to work with the Governor of Virginia and the Mayor of the District of Columbia and federal officials to place priority on the development of a long-range plan for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the General Assembly invite the Governor to report on progress on the plan during the 2006 legislative session; and be it further
