- 18 flexible fender extensions, mudflaps and spray suppressant devices, and load-induced
- 19 tire bulges; providing the equipment or device, other than mirrors, does not extend
- 20 more than 3 inches on each side of the vehicle beyond the statutory width limitation.

- 22 (1) Farm equipment;
- 23 Vehicle transporting farm equipment; or
- 24 (3) Vehicle carrying a load of forage crops in connection with harvesting
