2 Natural Resources - Hunting - Penalties

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the fines imposed by the Department of Natural
- 4 Resources on individuals who illegally take, purchase, offer, sell, barter, or
- 5 exchange game birds or mammals in excess of certain bag limits; requiring that
- 6 certain revenues generated by certain fines be paid to the State Wildlife
- 7 Management and Protection Fund; and generally relating to increasing the
- 8 penalties for illegally taking game animals.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - Natural Resources

- 17 10-1101.
- 18 (a) For the purpose of this title, each game bird or mammal taken illegally,
- 19 purchased, offered for purchase, sold, bartered, or exchanged in excess of the bag limit
- 20 or possessed illegally constitutes a separate offense.
- 21 (b) Any person who violates any provision of this title is guilty of a
- 22 misdemeanor. Unless another penalty is specifically provided elsewhere in this title,
- 23 the person, upon conviction, is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$1,500] \$4,500, with
- 24 costs imposed in the discretion of the court.
- 25 (c) Unless another penalty is specifically provided elsewhere in this title
- 26 any person found guilty of a second or subsequent violation of any provision of this
- 27 title, is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$4,000] \$12,000, or imprisonment not
- 28 exceeding 1 year, or both, with costs imposed in the discretion of the court.

- 1 (2) In addition, the license under which the person operated in the 2 commission of the violation shall be suspended for 12 months from the date of the
- 3 second conviction.
- 4 (3) For the purpose of this subsection, a second or subsequent violation is
- 5 a violation which has occurred within 2 years of any prior violation of this title and
- 6 which arises out of a separate set of circumstances.
- 7 (d) In addition to any administrative penalty provided in this title, violation of
- 8 any regulation adopted by any unit within the Department pursuant to the provisions
- 9 of this title is a misdemeanor and is punishable as provided in subsections (b) and (c)
- 10 of this section.
- 11 (e) This section does not apply to a violation of § 10-424(2) of this title.
- 12 (F) IF A FINE IS IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION, THE FINE, LESS THE COSTS
- 13 OF COLLECTION, SHALL BE PAID TO THE STATE WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AND
- 14 PROTECTION FUND.
