16 WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE ISSUED FOR USE ON THE PREMISES OF AN
17 EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL FOUNDATION LOCATED IN THE 42ND PRECINCT OF
18 THE 27TH WARD OF BALTIMORE CITY.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 20 effect July 1, 2005.
