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1 [(b)](C) "Circumventional information" means information, including (1) 2 pass codes, that allows an individual to alter the operation of a security system. 3 (2) "Circumventional information" does not include generic user or 4 installation manuals. 5 [(c)](D) "Firm" means a partnership or corporation. (E) "Firm member" means a partner of a partnership or an officer or 6 [(d)]7 director of a corporation. 8 "License" means a license issued by the Secretary or the Secretary's [(e)](F) 9 designee to engage in the business of providing security systems services for compensation. 11 [(f)](G) "Providing security systems services" means providing, on the 12 premises of a person's residential or commercial property, the service of: 13 surveying the property for purposes of installing a security system; (1) 14 physically installing, maintaining, or repairing a security system for (2) 15 the customer; or responding to a distress call or an alarm sounding from a security 16 (3) 17 system. 18 (H) "Representative member" means a firm member who is appointed [(g)]under this title to act on behalf of the firm. 20 [(h)] (I) "Secretary" means the Secretary of State Police or the Secretary's 21 designee. 22 "Security systems agency" means an individual or a firm that conducts a business that provides security systems services. 23 24 "Security systems technician" means a person who personally [(i)](K) provides security systems services. 26 18-202. 27 (a) In addition to any powers set forth elsewhere, the Secretary may: 28 (1) adopt regulations to carry out this title; 29 (2) use any member of the Department of State Police, as necessary, to 30 carry out and enforce this title; and 31 (3) make inquiries and conduct an investigation regarding any applicant 32 for a license or for registration. 33 (b) In addition to any duties set forth elsewhere, the Secretary shall:

- 8 (E) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER FOR INCOMPETENCE OR 9 MISCONDUCT.
- 10 (F) THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION BUT 11 ARE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE 12 TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 13 (G) (1) A MAJORITY OF THE FULL AUTHORIZED MEMBERSHIP OF THE 14 BOARD IS A QUORUM TO DO BUSINESS.
- 15 (2) THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE TIMES AND PLACES OF ITS 16 MEETINGS.
- 17 (H) THE BOARD MAY SET REASONABLE FEES TO PRODUCE FUNDS TO 18 APPROXIMATE THE COST OF CARRYING OUT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
- 19 (I) THE BOARD SHALL DEVELOP TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR SECURITY 20 SYSTEMS TECHNICIANS.
