## Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 2 6-201. 3 (d) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Baltimore City. 4 (xi) Notwithstanding any restriction or requirement in this article regarding the issuance of Class B beer, wine and liquor licenses, a not for profit arts center in the Highlandtown arts and entertainment district that holds a Class C license on June 1, 2004, may apply to the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City to convert that license [on or before May 31, 2005,] into a Class B
