15 (A) IF THE ADMINISTRATION, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE TRANSIT
16 OPERATOR, DETERMINES THAT ANY BUS PASSENGER SHELTER DOES NOT SERVE
17 THE PUBLIC INTEREST OR IS IN VIOLATION OF FEDERAL OR STATE LAW, THE
18 ADMINISTRATION MAY TERMINATE THE PRIVILEGE OF MAINTAINING THAT BUS
19 PASSENGER SHELTER AND ANY COMMERCIAL ADVERTISING SIGNS ON THE BUS
20 PASSENGER SHELTER WITHOUT COMPENSATION TO THE VENDOR.

(B) IF A BUS PASSENGER SHELTER POSES AN IMMINENT SAFETY THREAT,
THE ADMINISTRATION MAY REMOVE THE BUS PASSENGER SHELTER WITHOUT PRIOR
CONSULTATION WITH THE TRANSIT OPERATOR.
