- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Adult Education and Literacy Waiting List
- 4 Reduction Fund in the Division of Career Technology and Adult Learning in the
- 5 State Department of Education; requiring the Department to make certain
- 6 efforts to reduce the waiting list for adult education and literacy services;
- 7 specifying the purpose of the Fund; specifying that the Fund is a continuing,
- 8 nonlapsing fund, that the State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and
- 9 that the Comptroller shall account for the Fund; specifying that the Fund
- 10 consists of certain donations and other moneys accepted for certain purposes;
- requiring the Department to distribute the Fund as Literacy Works grants in
- order to reduce the waiting list for certain adult education and literacy services;
- allowing a subtraction modification under the Maryland individual and
- corporate income tax for certain donations to the Fund; declaring the intent of
- the General Assembly; providing for the application of this Act; and generally
- relating to funding for adult education and literacy services.

- 8 WHEREAS, The economy of Maryland needs an educated workforce to be
- 9 competitive; and
- WHEREAS, There is a very high correlation between adult literacy and factors
- 11 that contribute to a strong economy; and
- WHEREAS, Research has shown that improving employees' basic skills creates
- 13 an economic benefit for employers as well as workers and their families; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Low literacy affects the economic well being of the counties and
- 15 Baltimore City; and
- WHEREAS, The State is contributing only 8% of the cost of adult education;
- 17 and
- WHEREAS, An estimated 700,000 to 900,000 Maryland adults do not have a
- 19 high school diploma or lack the skill to speak English well; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The National Adult Literacy Survey reports that 20% of
- 21 Marylanders function at the lowest literacy level; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland provides adult education and literacy services to only 4%
- 23 of the target population; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Each year, over 16,000 Maryland adults apply to take the GED test
- 25 and 45% fail the test due to lack of preparation; and
- WHEREAS, Nearly 107,000 foreign-born Maryland residents were identified
- 27 as speaking English "not well" or "not at all" in the April 2001 Supplemental Survey
- 28 to the 2000 Census; and
- 29 WHEREAS, There is an unmet demand for services in many areas of the State,
- 30 as documented by waiting periods of 3 months to a year for classes in some areas; and
- 31 WHEREAS, There are 4,000 to 5,000 adults on waiting lists annually for adult
- 32 education and literacy services; and

1 WHEREAS, The task force appointed by the General Assembly in 2001 to study 2 adult education-related services emphasized the need for an immediate increase in 3 funding in adult education services; now, therefore, SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Education** 6 7 5-219. 8 IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT 9 OF EDUCATION SHALL REDUCE THE WAITING LIST FOR ADULT EDUCATION AND 10 LITERACY SERVICES BY ACTIVELY SEEKING DONATIONS FROM THE PRIVATE SECTOR 11 FOR THE ADULT EDUCATION AND WAITING LIST REDUCTION FUND ESTABLISHED 12 UNDER § 5-220 OF THIS SUBTITLE. 13 5-220. IN THIS SECTION, "FUND" MEANS THE ADULT EDUCATION AND LITERACY 14 (A) 15 WAITING LIST REDUCTION FUND. 16 (B) THERE IS AN ADULT EDUCATION AND LITERACY WAITING LIST (1) 17 REDUCTION FUND IN THE DIVISION OF CAREER TECHNOLOGY AND ADULT LEARNING 18 IN THE DEPARTMENT. THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO SUPPLEMENT GENERAL FUND 19 (2) 20 APPROPRIATIONS TO ADULT EDUCATION AND LITERACY SERVICES. THE FUND IS A CONTINUING, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT 21 (3)22 SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

THE TREASURER SHALL SEPARATELY HOLD AND THE COMPTROLLER

THE FUND SHALL BE INVESTED AND REINVESTED IN THE SAME

ANY INVESTMENT EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE PAID INTO

- (D) 1 EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND SHALL BE MADE BY AN APPROPRIATION 2 IN THE ANNUAL STATE BUDGET OR BY APPROVED BUDGET AMENDMENT AS 3 PROVIDED UNDER § 7-209 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE. THE MONEY IN THE FUND SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED BY THE DEPARTMENT 4 5 AS LITERACY WORKS GRANTS TO REDUCE THE WAITING LIST FOR ADULT EDUCATION 6 AND LITERACY SERVICES.
