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1 (f) The Board of Public Works may not approve a grant or loan from the Fund 2 to a volunteer company if the volunteer company has not made a good faith effort to 3 obtain money from its local government. 4 [8-205.] 8-204. 5 A volunteer company shall submit each request for [money] A GRANT (a) 6 OR LOAN from the Fund to the Association for approval by a board of review in 7 accordance with the Association's bylaws. 8 (2) Each request for [money] A GRANT OR LOAN shall include: 9 financial statements for the 2 fiscal years immediately 10 preceding the fiscal year in which the request is made; 11 (ii) any available audit of the financial statements; and 12 (iii) a detailed explanation of the reasons for the request. For each request for [money] A GRANT OR LOAN from the Fund, the 13 14 volunteer company shall certify that the volunteer company applied for money from 15 its local government and was denied, either wholly or partly. 16 If the Association disapproves a request or does not take action 17 within 45 days after the request, the volunteer company requesting [money] A 18 GRANT OR LOAN may appeal to a panel composed of the president of the Association, 19 the State Fire Marshal, and the chairman of the Fire and Rescue Education and 20 Training Commission. 21 (2)The decision of the panel is final and is not subject to further review. 22 On approval of a request for [money] A GRANT OR LOAN, the Association 23 or the panel shall transmit its recommendation to the [Department with the request 24 for money and any other supporting information required by the Department] BOARD 25 OF PUBLIC WORKS. 26 (d) [(1)]The Department shall forward each request for money from the Fund 27 to the Department of Legislative Services for review. - 27 first.

- 30 appropriation for grants and loans from the Volunteer Company Assistance Fund
- 31 established under § 8-202 of the Public Safety Article.
- 32 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 33 July 1, 2005.
