- 1 (f) The Task Force shall study electronic health records and the current and 2 potential expansion of electronic health record utilization in the State, including:
- 3 (1) electronic transfer;
- 4 (2) electronic prescribing;
- 5 (3) computerized physician order entry; and
- 6 (4) the cost of implementing items (1) through (3) of this subsection in 7 the State.
- 8 (g) The Task Force shall report its findings to the Governor and, subject to § 9 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before December 10 31, 2006.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
