 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 performed by a parent or stepparent of the child.

17 If the person for whom relief is sought is a vulnerable adult, "abuse" (3) 18 may also include abuse of a vulnerable adult, as defined in Title 14, Subtitle 1 of this
