A BILL ENTITLED

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Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2005 and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2000, 2002, 2003, and 2004

- FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Six 5 Hundred Sixty-Five Million, Three Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars 6 (\$665,335,000) the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, 7 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and 8 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in 9 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other 10 organizations for certain purposes, subject to the requirement that certain 11 grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain type by a certain date; 12 providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; 13 providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior capital budgets and 14 bond loan acts to be expended for other public projects; altering certain 15 requirements for certain programs in prior capital budget acts; providing that 16 the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loan 17 acts be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain additional information 18 to be detailed about each project in the capital program; repealing a requirement 19 for a certain appropriation; and generally relating to the financing of certain 20 capital projects. 21

- 10 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2005 in the total principal amount of \$665,335,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8–117 through 8–124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, a recipient of the proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for a purpose prohibited by this Act.

SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, the Comptroller may advance funds to any loan funds account established pursuant to a general obligation bond loan enabling Act, for any expenditure authorized by that Act, provided that if general obligation bonds have not been issued under the authority of that Act, the next ensuing sale of general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of that Act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of the funds so advanced.

SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, the net new debt to be authorized by legislation in fiscal year 2006 may not exceed \$670,000,000, as evidenced by the following:
