CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Register of Wills - Salary**

3 FOR the purpose of ~~removing~~ altering a certain limit on the maximum salary that the
4 Board of Public Works may set for a register of wills; and providing that this Act
5 does not apply to the salary or compensation of an incumbent register of wills.

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 **Article - Estates and Trusts**

6 2-205.

7 (a) (1) It is the intent of this section that each register shall receive a fair
8 and adequate compensation for the effort and duties required of the register by the
9 register's office.

10 (2) The volume and character of work done by the register shall be in
11 comparison to the salary fixed by the Board of Public Works for each of the other
12 registers.

13 (b) (1) Each register is entitled to receive an annual salary ~~of not more~~
14 ~~than \$85,000~~ ~~\$110,000~~ \$98,500, to be determined in each instance by the Board of
15 Public Works.

16 (2) In determining the annual salary of the register, the Board of Public
17 Works shall be guided in the exercise of its discretion by:

18 (i) The population of the county determined by the last official
19 United States census;

20 (ii) The dollar volume of total fees and taxes collected and excess
21 fees turned over to the State for each of the preceding 5 years by the office of the
22 register for which the salary is being fixed; and

23 (iii) Other pertinent data which have relation to the reasonableness
24 of the salary in relation to the work done and volume handled by the office.

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, §
26 35 of the Maryland Constitution, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to
27 the salary or compensation of the registers of wills in office on the effective date of
28 this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the
29 registers of wills shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31 October 1, 2005.
