15	(b) The Task Force shall consist of the following members:
16 17	(1) three members from the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
18 19	(2) three members from the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate; and
20 21	(3) the Secretary of Budget and Management, or the Secretary's designee.
22 23	(c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall jointly designate the Chair of the Task Force;
