17                       (I)     THAT IS ORGANIZED TO ENGAGE IN COMMERCIAL  
18 TRANSACTIONS INCLUDING THE LEASE OR RENTAL OF EQUIPMENT;

19                       (II)    THAT IS AT LEAST 51% OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY ONE OR  
20 MORE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE DISABLED VETERANS;

21                       (III)   THAT IS MANAGED BY ONE OR MORE OF THE DISABLED  
22 VETERANS WHO OWN IT;

23                       (IV)    THAT HAS ITS HOME OFFICE OR PRIMARY PLACE OF BUSINESS  
24 IN THE STATE;

25                       (V)     THAT HAS SUBMITTED COPIES OF ITS FEDERAL TAX RETURNS

30 NOT LESS THAN 5 YEARS, AND IF CERTIFIED AS A DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS
