AN INDIVIDUAL MAY SERVE AS A MOTORCYCLE FUNERAL ESCORT IF THE 3 (A) 4 INDIVIDUAL HAS A MOTORCYCLE FUNERAL ESCORT LICENSE ISSUED BY THE 5 DEPARTMENT, AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION. When the red signal changes to green while the funeral procession is still 30 within the intersection, a vehicle facing a green signal may proceed, but the funeral 31 procession has the right-of-way.

The driver of a vehicle in a funeral procession does not have any privilege

Subject to § 22-221(g) of this article, the warning lamps of the vehicle

The headlights of the vehicle are turned on; and
