A BILL ENTITLED

2	Elections - Study Commission on the Redistricting Process in Maryland

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Study Commission on the Redistricting Process in
- 4 Maryland; specifying the composition, powers, and duties of the Commission;
- 5 providing for the staffing of the Commission; requiring the Commission to
- 6 report its findings and recommendations, including suggested constitutional
- and legislative changes, to the Governor and to the General Assembly by a
- 8 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to
- 9 the Study Commission on the Redistricting Process in Maryland.
- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 11 MARYLAND, That:

1 AN ACT concerning

- 12 (a) There is a Study Commission on the Redistricting Process in Maryland.
- 13 (b) The Commission shall consist of the following 15 members:
- 14 (1) Three members of the Senate of Maryland, one of whom shall be a
- 15 member of the minority party of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 16 (2) Three members of the House of Delegates of Maryland, one of whom
- 17 shall be a member of the minority party of the House, appointed by the Speaker of the
- 18 House;
- 19 Seven individuals appointed by the Governor, including:
- 20 (i) A representative of the League of Women Voters of Maryland;
- 21 (ii) A representative of the Center for Voting and Democracy, a
- 22 Maryland organization;
- 23 (iii) A representative of the Maryland Institute for Policy Analysis
- 24 and Research at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County; and
- 25 (iv) Four other individuals, chosen from among individuals and
- 26 organizations representing the ethnic diversity of the State and who have

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- 1 demonstrated strong civic and community involvement and participation in the 2 electoral process; and
- 3 (4) Two members of the general public, one appointed by the President of 4 the Senate and one appointed by the Speaker of the House.
- 5 (c) The Governor shall designate the chair of the Commission.
- 6 (d) The Department of Legislative Services and the State Board of Elections 7 shall provide staff for the Commission.
- 8 (e) The Commission shall:
- 9 (1) Examine the current redistricting process in Maryland as it relates to 10 the redistricting of the General Assembly and the State's representatives to the
- 11 United States Congress following each decennial census;
- 12 (2) Collect and analyze information relating to the manner and methods
- 13 utilized for state legislative and United States congressional redistricting in other
- 14 states around the country following each decennial census;
- 15 (3) As it considers appropriate, receive testimony from and consult with
- 16 individuals who are knowledgeable about State and federal constitutional and
- 17 statutory requirements and other matters related to the redistricting process; and
- 18 (4) Suggest any State constitutional or statutory changes that it
- 19 concludes are desirable in order to improve the redistricting process in Maryland.
- 20 (f) On or before December 31, 2005, the Commission shall report its findings
- 21 and recommendations, including any proposed changes to the Maryland Constitution
- 22 or any statutory changes to the Maryland election law, to the Governor, and, subject
- 23 to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly for
- 24 consideration by the General Assembly in the 2006 Session.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 26 June 1, 2005. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the
- 27 end of June 30, 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 28 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
