A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 3	Adoption - Placement Services for Children in Public Foster Care - State Contracts with Private Licensed Child Placement Agencies
4 5 7 8 9 10 11	FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Human Resources to allocate not less than a certain amount of money from the Department's fiscal year 2005 budget appropriations to develop, implement, and monitor a program though which qualified licensed child placement agencies may enter into contracts with the State to provide adoption placement services for Maryland children in public foster care who have no identified permanency resource; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the placement of children in public foster care in permanent adoption arrangements.
12	Preamble
	WHEREAS, There are approximately 500 Maryland children in public foster care waiting to be adopted for whom there are no families currently identified as being available to adopt them; and
16 17	WHEREAS, Many children in Maryland foster care have been waiting for more than 5 years to be placed for adoption; and
18 19	WHEREAS, Adoption presents the best opportunity for permanency when children in public foster care are unable to be safely raised by their birth families; and
	WHEREAS, There are many licensed private child placement agencies within and outside of Maryland that have the knowledge, expertise, and ability to place children for adoption who are in public foster care; and
	WHEREAS, There are many families in Maryland who are adopting children in public foster care from other states that provide financial assistance to adoption agencies to help defray the costs of their services; and
	WHEREAS, The State of Maryland does not currently make financial resources available to licensed private child placement agencies to enable those agencies to place children from public foster care for adoption; now, therefore,

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1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

2 MARYLAND, That the Department of Human Resources shall allocate not less than

3 \$500,000 from the Department's fiscal year 2005 budget appropriations to develop,

4 implement, and monitor a program though which qualified licensed child placement

5 agencies may enter into contracts with the State to provide adoption placement

6 services for Maryland children in public foster care who have no identified

7 permanency resource.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an

9 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health

10 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the

11 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take

12 effect from the date it is enacted.
