A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Consolidation of State Forest and Park Services Rangers and Natural**
3 **Resources Police - Exemption from Probationary Status**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing an exemption for certain employees of the State
5 Forest and Park Service from the probationary time period for a Natural
6 Resources police officer; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally
7 relating to Natural Resources police officers.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
9 Article - Natural Resources

11 Annotated Code of Maryland

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article - Natural Resources**

16 1-203.

17 (e) (1) [All] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION,
18 ALL Natural Resources police officers, including persons appointed for training prior
19 to regular assignment as a Natural Resources police officer, shall remain in a
20 probationary status for a period of 2 years from the date of initial appointment to the
21 Natural Resources Police Force. The Secretary may discharge an employee in
22 probationary status for any cause which is deemed sufficient in the sole discretion of
23 the Secretary.

24 (2) A PERSON SHALL BE EXEMPTED FROM THE PROBATIONARY STATUS
25 AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF THE PERSON:

1 (I) WAS A SWORN LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE OF THE STATE
2 FOREST AND PARK SERVICE ON MARCH 24, 2004; AND

3 (II) WAS APPOINTED AS A NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE OFFICER
4 ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2004.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
6 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
7 has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
8 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
9 the date it is enacted.
