1 AN ACT concerning

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### Consolidation of State Forest and Park Rangers and Natural Resources Police <del>- Classification Title</del>

4 FOR the purpose of establishing certain classification titles in the transfer of position

- 5 identification numbers for certain sworn law enforcement employees in the
- 6 implementation of the consolidation of the State Forest and Park Rangers and
- 7 Natural Resources Police; making this Act an emergency measure; and
- 8 generally relating to the classification title and position identification numbers
- 9 in the consolidation of the State Forest and Park Rangers and the Natural

10 Resources Police.

11 FOR the purpose of confirming the status of certain employees as police officers and

12 preserving those officers' law enforcement commissions; making this Act an

13 emergency measure; and generally relating to the status and commissions of

14 certain police officers.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That:

17 (a) In the implementation of the consolidation of the Natural Resources Police

18 and the State Forest and Park Rangers, the position identification numbers under the

19 State personnel system shall be transferred as follows:

All employees commissioned, as of March 24, 2004, as law enforcement 38 <u>(b)</u>

39 officers of the State Forest and Park Service pursuant to Title 5, Subtitle 2 of the
 40 Natural Resources Article shall retain their law enforcement officer commission and

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certification for the duration of their employment with the Department of Natural
 <u>Resources</u> Forest and Park Service or any successor organization.

3 (c) (1) The classification title of the position of law enforcement officer of the 4 Maryland Forest and Park Service at the rank of sergeant and above shall reflect the

5 status of the position as a law enforcement officer.

6(2)Use of the words sergeant, lieutenant, captain, major, lieutenant7colonel, or colonel in the classification title meets the requirements of this paragraph.

8 (d) (1) <u>A law enforcement officer of the Maryland Forest and Park Service</u>

9 shall be eligible and considered for any promotional opportunities for positions in the

10 Maryland Forest and Park Service, and if selected for a position, shall assume the

11 appropriate law enforcement officer classification title and rank of the officer who

12 most recently held that position.

13 (2) Paragraph (1) of this subsection does not apply to applications for

14 employment or promotional opportunities in the Natural Resources Police. A law

15 <u>enforcement officer of the Forest and Park Service who wishes to apply for a position</u>

16 in the Natural Resources Police shall comply with the hiring requirements of the

17 Natural Resources Police.

18 (e) Except as provided for herein, nothing in this section shall be construed to

19 limit the authority of the Secretary or other official of the Department of Natural

20 <u>Resources to control and manage the Maryland Forest and Park Service.</u>

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an

22 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health

23 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the

24 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take

25 effect from the date it is enacted.

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
