23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any consent that a State official, including the Governor, has given for the State of Maryland to be bound by the government procurement rules of any international trade agreement on or before the effective date of this Act is declared invalid and the State of Maryland is not bound by the government procurement rules of any international trade agreement for which a State official, including the Governor, has given consent for the State of Maryland to be bound to on or before the effective date of this Act.
