7 WHEREAS, The State of Maryland procures services in part through contracts8 with private vendors; and

9 WHEREAS, Increasingly private vendors carry out these services, or
10 subcontract or otherwise procure these services, from a location outside the United
11 States; and

WHEREAS, Such international outsourcing exacerbates unemployment and
workforce dislocation and deprives Maryland residents of job opportunities, including
industries and jobs this State has expended resources to attract; and

WHEREAS, International outsourcing erodes State and local revenues bydrawing jobs and income away from the State; and

WHEREAS, International outsourcing additionally may provide less privacy
protections for State residents whose personal information may, in the course of
service delivery, be transmitted to locations outside the United States; now, therefore,

23 (A) A UNIT MAY NOT AWARD A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT FOR SERVICES IF
24 MORE THAN 5% OF THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY A CONTRACTOR OR
25 SUBCONTRACTOR WILL BE RENDERED FROM A SITE THAT IS OUTSIDE THE UNITED
26 STATES.

27 (B) (1) EACH CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR SUBMITTING A BID OR
28 PROPOSAL TO PROVIDE SERVICES FOR THE STATE SHALL CERTIFY THAT AT LEAST
29 95% OF THE SERVICES WILL BE PERFORMED IN THE UNITED STATES.

(2) IF ANY SERVICES PROVIDED BY A CONTRACTOR OR
 SUBCONTRACTOR WILL BE RENDERED FROM A SITE OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES,
 ALONG WITH THE BID OR PROPOSAL, THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR SHALL
 GIVE THE UNIT WRITTEN NOTICE OF THE PERCENTAGE AND TYPE OF SERVICES
 THAT WILL BE RENDERED FROM A SITE OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES.

1(3)ALL SERVICES RENDERED FROM A SITE OUTSIDE THE UNITED2STATES MUST BE MERELY INCIDENTAL TO THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THE CONTRACT.

3 (4) IF THE UNIT DETERMINES THAT THE SERVICES TO BE RENDERED
4 FROM A SITE OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES ARE NOT MERELY INCIDENTAL TO THE
5 MAIN PURPOSE OF THE CONTRACT, THEN THE UNIT MAY NOT AWARD THE
6 CONTRACT TO THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR.

7 (C) IF, DURING THE LIFE OF THE CONTRACT, THE CONTRACTOR OR
8 SUBCONTRACTOR SHIFTS WORK OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES SO THAT MORE THAN
9 5% OF THE SERVICES WILL BE RENDERED FROM A SITE OUTSIDE THE UNITED
10 STATES OR IF THE UNIT DETERMINES THAT ANY OF THE SERVICES THAT ARE
11 RENDERED FROM A SITE OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES ARE NOT MERELY
12 INCIDENTAL:

13 (1) THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR SHALL PAY DAMAGES TO
14 THE UNIT IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE AMOUNT PAID BY THE UNIT FOR THE
15 PERCENTAGE OF WORK ABOVE 5% PERFORMED OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES; AND

16 (2) THE UNIT SHALL TERMINATE THE CONTRACT FOR 17 NONCOMPLIANCE.

18 (D) (1) THE UNIT MAY BRING A CIVIL ACTION IN STATE OR FEDERAL COURT 19 TO COMPEL ENFORCEMENT UNDER THIS SECTION.

20 (2) THE COURT SHALL AWARD REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES AND 21 COSTS TO THE UNIT.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 23 effect October 1, 2005.
