A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Prince George's County - Alcoholic Beverages - Part-Time Inspectors**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the number of part-time inspectors appointed by the
4 Board of License Commissioners of Prince George's County; and generally
5 relating to alcoholic beverages inspectors in Prince George's County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

19 15-112.

20 (r) (1) This subsection applies only in Prince George's County.

21 (2) The Board shall appoint an administrator, an attorney, and all
22 inspectors for the Board.

23 (3) (ii) There are three full-time and [29] 32 part-time inspectors, all
24 of whom shall be county residents. The three full-time inspector positions shall be
25 designated as the chief inspector and the deputy chief inspectors. The three full-time
26 inspectors who meet the standards set out by the Prince George's County merit board

1 and who are certified by the personnel director as meeting these standards shall be
2 entitled to the provisions of the county merit system.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
4 October 1, 2005.
