1 AN ACT concerning

2 Cecil County - Solicitation of Money or Donations from Occupants of 3 Vehicles - Prohibitions and Exceptions

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting, in Cecil County, a person from standing, or causing,

- 5 encouraging, allowing, or petitioning another to stand, in a roadway, median
- 6 divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a
- 7 vehicle, subject to a certain exception; authorizing the County Commissioners of
- 8 Cecil County or the governing body of a municipal corporation in Cecil County to
- 9 enact a certain permit program to allow individuals who are at least a certain
- 10 age and representatives of certain organizations who are at least a certain age to
- 11 solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle by standing in a
- 12 roadway, median divider, or intersection; requiring an applicant for a certain
- 13 permit to submit proof of adequate liability insurance and a certain safety plan;
- 14 providing that a permit issued under this Act only be effective for a certain time
- 15 period; providing that an individual or a certain organization may only obtain a
- 16 certain number of a certain permit per calendar year; defining certain terms;
- 17 and generally relating to the solicitation of money from occupants of vehicles in
- 18 Cecil County.

24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Transportation

2 21-507.

3 (a) Except for the occupant of a disabled vehicle who seeks the aid of another 4 vehicle, a person may not stand in a roadway to solicit a ride, employment, or 5 business from the occupant of any vehicle.

6 (b) A person may not stand on or near a highway to solicit any other person to 7 watch or guard any vehicle while it is parked or about to be parked on a highway.

8 (c) In Charles County, Frederick County, Harford County, and Washington 9 County, a person may not stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit 10 money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle.

11 (d) (1) In Prince George's County:

12 (i) A child under the age of 15 years may not stand in a roadway,
13 median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind from the
14 occupant of a vehicle; and

15 (ii) An adult may not cause, encourage, allow, or petition a child 16 under the age of 15 years to stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to 17 solicit money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle.

18 (2) A child under the age of 15 years may not be found guilty or 19 adjudicated delinquent for a violation of paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection if an adult 20 caused, encouraged, allowed, or petitioned the child in violation of paragraph (1)(ii) of 21 this subsection.

22 (e) (1) This subsection applies to Anne Arundel County.

23 (2) In this subsection, "qualified organization" means a fire company or a
24 bona fide religious, fraternal, civic, war veterans', or charitable organization.

25 (3) The Anne Arundel County Council may, by ordinance, enact a

26 licensing program for individuals who are 18 years old or older and qualified

27 organizations that wish to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle

28 by standing in a roadway, median divider, or intersection.

29(4)The restriction on the age of individuals who may be licensed under30the authority granted to the Anne Arundel County Council under paragraph (3) of

31 this subsection applies to individuals who participate in the solicitation of donations

32 as members or on behalf of the qualified organization.

33 (5) If the county council enacts an ordinance establishing a licensing
34 program authorized by paragraph (3) of this subsection, the ordinance:

15 (6) An ordinance that imposes a fee under paragraph (5) of this 16 subsection on an applicant that is a qualified organization organized on a national or 17 statewide basis and having more than one county or local chapter in the State shall 18 impose one fee to be paid by the national or statewide organization to cover all of the 19 county or local chapters in the State.		
20 (7) (i) If the county council enacts an ordinance establishing a 21 licensing program authorized by paragraph (3) of this subsection, an individual or 22 organization that decides not to seek to become licensed under the program may not 23 stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection in Anne Arundel County to solicit 24 money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle.		
 (ii) If the county council does not choose to enact an ordinance to establish a licensing program as authorized by paragraph (3) of this subsection, the provisions of this subsection may not be construed to prohibit an individual or qualified organization from standing in a roadway, median divider, or intersection in the county to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle. 		
 (8) If the county council enacts an ordinance establishing a licensing program authorized by paragraph (3) of this subsection, then on or before December 1 of the calendar year that occurs after the anniversary of the first 12 months of the implementation of the licensing program, the Anne Arundel County Police Department shall report in writing to the Anne Arundel County Delegation to the General Assembly on the effectiveness of the county police department's enforcement of the provisions of this subsection with respect to individuals and organizations to solicit money or donations on roadways, median dividers, or intersections in the county from the occupants of vehicles. 		

39 (F) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO CECIL COUNTY.

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1 (2) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "QUALIFIED ORGANIZATION" MEANS A FIRE 2 COMPANY OR BONA FIDE RELIGIOUS, FRATERNAL, CIVIC, WAR VETERANS', OR 3 CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION.

4 (3) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IN 5 CECIL COUNTY A PERSON MAY NOT:

6 (I) STAND IN A ROADWAY, MEDIAN DIVIDER, OR INTERSECTION TO 7 SOLICIT MONEY OR DONATIONS OF ANY KIND FROM THE OCCUPANT OF A VEHICLE; 8 OR

9 (II) CAUSE, ENCOURAGE, ALLOW, OR PETITION ANOTHER TO STAND

12 (4) (I) THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CECIL COUNTY OR THE
13 GOVERNING BODY OF A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION IN CECIL COUNTY MAY, BY
14 APPROPRIATE RESOLUTION OR ORDINANCE, ENACT A PERMIT PROGRAM TO ALLOW
15 INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD AND REPRESENTATIVES OF
16 QUALIFIED ORGANIZATIONS WHO ARE AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD TO SOLICIT MONEY
17 OR DONATIONS FROM THE OCCUPANT OF A VEHICLE BY STANDING IN A ROADWAY,
18 MEDIAN DIVIDER, OR INTERSECTION.

(II) IF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OR THE GOVERNING BODY OF

314.ALLOW AN INDIVIDUAL OR A QUALIFIED ORGANIZATION32TO OBTAIN ONLY ONE PERMIT PER CALENDAR YEAR.
