- 19 (A) IN THE DISTRICT COURT, IF THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT
- 20 HAS APPROVED THE USE OF VIDEO CONFERENCING IN THE COUNTY, A JUDICIAL
- 21 OFFICER MAY CONDUCT AN INITIAL APPEARANCE UNDER RULE 4-213(A), A REVIEW
- 22 OF THE COMMISSIONER'S PRETRIAL RELEASE DETERMINATION UNDER RULE
- 23 4-216(F), OR A PRESENTMENT UNDER RULE 4-212 WITH THE DEFENDANT AND THE
