1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Election Law - Early Voting**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a process to allow voters to vote in elections at early  
4 voting polling places in the State; specifying the period in which early voting is  
5 allowed; ~~specifying criteria and procedures to guide the State Administrator of~~  
6 ~~Elections in setting the number and location of early voting polling places for~~  
7 ~~each election; granting authority to certain entities to select early voting polling~~  
8 ~~places; establishing that each local board of elections has the final authority to~~  
9 ~~select the geographic locations for certain early voting polling places; requiring~~  
10 ~~the local boards of elections to establish the early voting polling places in each~~  
11 ~~county; requiring the local boards in certain counties to establish at least a~~  
12 ~~certain number of early voting polling places for each primary or general election;~~  
13 ~~requiring the Governor to allocate certain resources to implement this Act;~~  
14 requiring the State Board of Elections to adopt certain regulations and  
15 guidelines by a certain date; making certain provisions of law applicable to early  
16 voting; and generally relating to early voting in elections in the State.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 (A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER TITLE 9, SUBTITLE 3 OF THIS ARTICLE, A  
 11 VOTER SHALL VOTE:

12 (1) IN THE VOTER'S ASSIGNED PRECINCT ON ELECTION DAY; OR

13 (2) IN AN EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACE AS PROVIDED IN THIS  
 14 SECTION.

15 (B) EACH EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACE SHALL BE OPEN FOR VOTING:

16 (1) BEGINNING THE ~~EIGHTH DAY~~ TUESDAY BEFORE A PRIMARY OR  
 17 GENERAL ELECTION THROUGH THE ~~FRIDAY~~ SATURDAY BEFORE THE ELECTION; AND

18 (2) 8 HOURS EACH DAY DURING THE PERIOD SPECIFIED UNDER  
 19 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, ~~INCLUDING EACH SATURDAY AND SUNDAY.~~

20 ~~(C) (1) WITH THE ADVICE OF THE LOCAL ELECTION DIRECTOR, THE STATE  
 21 ADMINISTRATOR SHALL SET THE NUMBER OF EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACES THAT  
 22 EACH LOCAL BOARD MUST ESTABLISH.~~

23 ~~(2) (I) THE GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION OF EARLY VOTING POLLING  
 24 PLACES SHALL BE SELECTED IN EQUAL PROPORTIONS BY:~~

25 ~~(I) 1 THE PRINCIPAL MAJORITY POLITICAL PARTY; AND~~

26 ~~(II) 2 THE PRINCIPAL MINORITY POLITICAL PARTY; AND~~

27 ~~3 THE LOCAL BOARD BASED ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF

30 ~~(II) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH,  
 31 EACH LOCAL BOARD HAS THE FINAL AUTHORITY TO SELECT THE GEOGRAPHIC  
 32 LOCATIONS FOR THE NUMBER OF EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACES DESIGNATED BY  
 33 THE STATE ADMINISTRATOR FOR THAT COUNTY.~~

4           (4)     ~~THE NUMBER OF GEOGRAPHIC LOCATIONS SELECTED BY THE~~

9     (C)     (1)     EACH LOCAL BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH THE EARLY VOTING POLLING  
 10 PLACES IN ITS COUNTY.

11           (2)     (1)     IN THE FOLLOWING COUNTIES, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL  
 12 ESTABLISH AT LEAST THREE EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACES FOR EACH PRIMARY  
 13 OR GENERAL ELECTION:

14                     1.     ANNE ARUNDEL;

15                     2.     BALTIMORE CITY;

16                     3.     BALTIMORE COUNTY;

17                     4.     HARFORD;

18                     5.     HOWARD;

19                     6.     MONTGOMERY; AND

20                     7.     PRINCE GEORGE'S.

21                     (II)     IN EACH COUNTY OTHER THAN A COUNTY SPECIFIED IN  
 22 SUBPARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH AT  
 23 LEAST ONE EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACE FOR EACH PRIMARY OR GENERAL  
 24 ELECTION.

25           (4)     (4)     (3)     POLLING PLACES ESTABLISHED BY A LOCAL BOARD  
 26 UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 10-101 OF THIS TITLE.

27           (4)     (4)     ~~IF A LOCAL BOARD CANNOT ESTABLISH A POLLING PLACE IN~~  
 28 ~~THE GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION REQUESTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE~~  
 29 ~~REQUESTING ENTITY MAY MAKE ANOTHER REQUEST.~~

30     (D)     (1)     A VOTER MAY VOTE AT ANY EARLY VOTING POLLING ~~LOCATION~~  
 31 PLACE IN THE VOTER'S COUNTY OF RESIDENCE.

32           (2)     THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL ENSURE THAT EVERY BALLOT STYLE  
 33 USED IN THE COUNTY FOR THE ELECTION IS AVAILABLE AT THE EARLY VOTING  
 34 POLLING ~~LOCATIONS~~ PLACES.

1 (E) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2006, THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT  
2 REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES FOR THE CONDUCT OF EARLY VOTING.

3 (F) ANY PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE THAT APPLIES TO ELECTION DAY ALSO  
4 SHALL APPLY TO EARLY VOTING.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor shall  
6 allocate the resources required to implement the requirements of this Act, including  
7 any gift received by the State for the purposes of this Act under § 2-201 of the State  
8 Finance and Procurement Article, or, except for federal funds received by the State to  
9 implement the requirements of the Help America Vote Act 2002, any federal or other  
10 funds or grant received by the State in accordance with federal and State law for the  
11 purposes of this Act by fiscal year 2007 and each fiscal year thereafter.

12 SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
