2 **Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities - Quality of Care Oversight**

3 FOR the purpose of changing the name of the Oversight Committee on Quality of
4 Care in Nursing Homes to the Oversight Committee on Quality of Care in
5 Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities; altering the membership of the
6 Oversight Committee; altering the duties of the Oversight Committee; altering
7 certain reporting requirements; requiring the Department of Human Resources
8 to provide staff support to the Oversight Committee; repealing a certain
9 termination provision; and generally relating to the quality of care in nursing
10 homes and assisted living facilities and the Oversight Committee on Quality of
11 Care in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (a) There is an Oversight Committee on Quality of Care in Nursing Homes
4 AND ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES.

5 (b) The Oversight Committee shall consist of the following members:

7 appointed by the President of the Senate;

9 Environmental Affairs Committee, appointed by the President of the Senate;

20 Aging;

14 Governor, ONE OF WHICH SHALL BE A CONSUMER LIVING IN AN ASSISTED LIVING
15 FACILITY.

16 (c) The Secretary of Aging shall chair the Oversight Committee.

17 (d) [The Oversight Committee shall monitor and evaluate implementation of
18 the recommendations of the Task Force on Quality of Care in Nursing Facilities,
19 created pursuant to Chapters 382 and 383 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1999
20 and relevant legislation enacted subsequent to the recommendations of the Task
21 Force.

22 (e)] The Oversight Committee shall evaluate the progress in improving
23 nursing home care quality AND ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY QUALITY statewide,
24 including consideration of:

25 (1) Quality of care standards for nursing homes AND ASSISTED LIVING
26 FACILITIES;

27 (2) STANDARDS FOR THE IDENTIFICATION OF THE ONSET OF DEMENTIA
28 AND ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE;

29 (3) STANDARDS FOR THE IDENTIFICATION OF CONDITIONS
30 APPROPRIATE FOR HOSPICE SERVICES;

31 [(2)] ~~(3)~~ (4) Staffing patterns and staffing standards;

32 [(3)] ~~(4)~~ (5) Policies and procedures for inspecting nursing homes AND
33 ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES, and responding to quality of care complaints;

34 [(4)] ~~(5)~~ (6) A comparison of Maryland standards, policies, and
35 procedures to those in other states;

1 [(5)] ~~(6)~~ (7) The labor pool available to fill nursing and nursing aide
2 jobs; ~~and~~

3 [(6)] ~~(7)~~ (8) State funding mechanisms for nursing homes AND
4 ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES, including the Medicaid Nursing Home Reimbursement
5 System, and regulation of nursing homes; AND

6 (9) THE PROVISION AND QUALITY OF MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL
7 HEALTH CARE SERVICES TO MEET THE NEEDS OF NURSING HOME AND ASSISTED
8 LIVING FACILITY RESIDENTS.

9 [(f)] (E) [(1)] The Office of Health Care Quality in the Department of Health
10 and Mental Hygiene shall submit a report to the Oversight Committee [twice]
11 annually on the [implementation of the Task Force recommendations and the] status
12 of quality of care in nursing homes AND ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES.

13 [(2)] The reports shall be submitted on March 1 and September 1 of each
14 year.]

15 [(g)] (F) The Deputy Secretary of Health Care Financing, OR THE DEPUTY
16 SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE, shall report annually to the Oversight Committee on the
17 status of the Medicaid Nursing Home Reimbursement System, which shall include
18 but not be limited to:

19 (1) Elements of the existing methodology that are no longer relevant;

20 (2) Elements of the existing methodology that can be revised;

21 (3) The appropriateness of redesigning the system given changing
22 demographics of the target population; and

23 (4) General Fund and federal fund savings from a system redesign that
24 may be redirected to nursing home staff development in the nursing cost center.

25 [(h)] (G) The Oversight Committee shall review the reports of the Office of
26 Health Care Quality and the Deputy Secretary of Health Care Financing and develop
27 recommendations to continue improvement in nursing home AND ASSISTED LIVING
28 FACILITY care.

29 [(i)] (H) The Oversight Committee shall report its findings and
30 recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government
31 Article, to the General Assembly on or before December 1 of each year.

32 [(j)] (I) The Department of Aging, with assistance from the Department of
33 Health and Mental Hygiene, THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, and the
34 Department of Legislative Services, shall provide staff support for the Oversight
35 Committee.

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Chapter 216 of the Acts of 2000

2 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
3 October 1, 2000. [It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and 3 months and, at
4 the end of December 31, 2005, with no further action required by the General
5 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]

7 October 1, 2005.
