A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Hurricane Isabel Disaster Relief Act - Reporting Requirements - Extension**
3 **of Termination**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Housing and Community
5 Development to issue to the General Assembly on or before a certain date an
6 interim report on the implementation of the Hurricane Isabel Disaster Relief
7 Act; altering the date on or before which the Department of Housing and
8 Community Development shall issue to the General Assembly a final report on
9 the implementation of the Hurricane Isabel Disaster Relief Act; altering the
10 date at the end of which a certain section of the Hurricane Isabel Disaster Relief
11 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect; making this Act an
12 emergency measure; and generally relating to the Hurricane Isabel Disaster
13 Relief Act.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Chapter 7 of the Acts of 2004**

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
24 Housing and Community Development shall issue to the General Assembly, in
25 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, a preliminary report on or
26 before September 30, 2004, AN INTERIM REPORT ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2005,
27 and a final report on or before September 30, [2005] 2006 on the implementation of
28 this Act. The reports shall include:

1 (a) with reference to loans provided by the Department, the amounts of the
2 loans and the borrowers' counties of residence;

3 (b) with reference to loans obtained in the private market for which the
4 Department provided credit enhancements, the amounts of the credit enhancements,
5 the borrowers' counties of residence, the names of the financial institutions that
6 provided the loans, and the amounts of the loans; and

7 (c) with reference to other financial assistance provided, including financial
8 assistance provided under the buy-down program, the amounts and sources of the
9 financial assistance and the borrowers' counties of residence.

10 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an
11 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health
12 or safety, has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the
13 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take
14 effect from the date it is enacted. Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective through
15 May 31, [2005] 2006 and, at the end of May 31, [2005] 2006, with no further action
16 required by the General Assembly, Section 1 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no
17 further force and effect.
