- 8 (2) TWO MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY THE 9 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE; AND

- 18 (5) PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY IN SCHOOLS;
- 19 (6) SYSTEMS TO ENSURE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NUTRITION AND 20 PHYSICAL ACTIVITY STANDARDS;
