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1 [(f)] (G) If the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services 2 determines that the benefits under this section are to be paid, the benefits shall be 3 paid:

5 (2) if no individual is eligible under item (1) of this subsection, to each 6 surviving child of the decedent in equal shares;

7 (3) (i) for a death benefit under subsection (b) of this section, if no
8 individual is eligible under item (1) or (2) of this subsection, to the decedent's
9 surviving parent, if the parent was a dependent as defined in § 152 of the Internal
10 Revenue Code; or

11 (ii) for any other benefit under this section, if no individual is 12 eligible under item (1) or (2) of this subsection, to the decedent's surviving parent; or

13 (4) if no individual is eligible under item (1), (2), or (3) of this subsection, 14 to the decedent's estate.

15 [(g)] (H) Payments under this section shall be made out of money that the 16 Governor includes for that purpose in the State budget.

17 [(h)] (I) A person aggrieved by a final decision of the Secretary of Public

18 Safety and Correctional Services under this section may seek judicial review as

19 provided for review of final decisions in Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State Government20 Article.
