 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall take effect on the date of approval by the federal Centers of Medicare and Medicaid Services, in accordance with the terms of the waiver granted to the State under § 1814(b) of the Social Security Act, of the method of funding the computerized eligibility system. If the method of funding the eligibility system is denied, this Act shall be null and void without the necessity of any further action by the General Assembly. The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, within 5 days after receiving notice of approval or denial of the method of funding, shall forward a copy of this notice to the Department of Legislative Services, 90 State Circle, Annapolis, Maryland 21401. 				

25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 2 of 26 this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 2005 July 1, 2005.

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
