17 interest earned on those contributions through the date of transfer.

(B) A MEMBER MAY TRANSFER THE MEMBER'S ELIGIBILITY SERVICE

(C) A MEMBER SHALL DEPOSIT CONTRIBUTIONS IN THE ANNUITY SAVINGS
FUND OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' PENSION SYSTEM AT THE RATE OF 4%
OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S EARNABLE COMPENSATION WHILE THE INDIVIDUAL IS A
MEMBER OF THE PENSION SYSTEM UNDER § 7-603 OF THE TRANSPORTATION
ARTICLE AFTER JULY 1, 2000, INCLUDING REGULAR INTEREST ON THE

(a) The Administration shall establish and maintain a police force to provide
protection for its patrons, personnel, and all railroad facilities and transit facilities
owned, leased, or operated upon, by, or under the control of the Administration. The
police force is charged with the responsibility of enforcing the applicable laws,
ordinances and regulations of the State and political subdivisions and the rules and
regulations of the Administration.

In consultation with the Maryland Police Training Commission, the 13 (c) (1)14 Administrator, with the approval of the Secretary, shall adopt standards, 15 qualifications, and prerequisites of character, training, education, human and public 16 relations, and experience for Maryland Transit Administration police officers,

including standards for the performance of their duties. 17

18 The Administrator shall adopt standards similar to the standards (2)adopted for the Department of State Police. 19

20 The Administrator with the approval of the Secretary shall adopt rules and (d) 21 regulations governing the operation and conduct of the Maryland Transit 22 Administration police force.

23 (e) The Administration may enter into agreements with railroad companies,

24 political subdivisions, and public safety agencies, including those of the federal

25 government, for the delineation of the functions and responsibilities of the

26 Administration's police force.

27 The Maryland Transit Administration police force may issue citations for (f) 28 violations of the rules and regulations adopted by the Administration under this title. 29 7-603.

4 (2) Provide that individuals eligible for admission to the system are not 5 eligible for admission to or eligible to receive any benefits from any other pension

6 system, except Social Security benefits, if the other system is financed or funded,

7 whether wholly or partially or directly or indirectly, by funds paid or appropriated by

8 the Administration; and

9 (3) Provide a system of benefits payable to the beneficiaries and

10 dependents of any participant in the system after the death of the participant,

11 whether accidental or not and whether occurring in the performance of duty or not,

12 subject to any exceptions, conditions, restrictions, and classifications that the

16 Administration is eligible to receive any pension, retirement, or other benefit both

17 under the Administration's system and under any other pension or retirement system

18 established by an acquired transportation system or provided for under any collective

19 bargaining agreement between the Administration and the authorized

20 representatives of its employees.

21 [(d)] (E) The pension system shall be financed or funded as the

22 Administration determines economically feasible.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect24 July 1, 2005.
