## A BILL ENTITLED

4 a Social Security number are required of certain applicants for recreational 5 fishing licenses; altering a certain prohibition so that the last four digits of a 6 Social Security number may not be disclosed in certain circumstances; altering 7 certain requirements so that certain custodians of public records must deny 8 certain inspections of the part of a recreational fishing license with the last four 9 digits of a Social Security number and must allow certain inspections of the part 10 of a recreational fishing license with the last four digits of a Social Security 11 number; and generally relating to requirements for and disclosure of Social 12 Security numbers for recreational fishing licenses.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
9 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Natural Resources

3 (1) (1) The Department shall require an applicant for any recreational 4 license under this title to provide the LAST FOUR DIGITS OF THE applicant's Social 5 Security number, if the applicant has a Social Security number.

6 (2) Except as provided in § 10-617 of the State Government Article, the 7 LAST FOUR DIGITS OF THE Social Security number of an applicant may not be 8 disclosed as part of the public record of the application.

11 (a) Unless otherwise provided by law, a custodian shall deny inspection of a 12 part of a public record, as provided in this section.
$13 \quad(\mathrm{k}) \quad(1) \quad$ Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a custodian
14 shall deny inspection of: 15 (I) the part of an application for a marriage license under § 2-402 16 of the Family Law Article THAT CONTAINS A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER; or 17 (II) THE PART OF a recreational license under Title 4 of the Natural 18 Resources Article that contains THE LAST FOUR DIGITS OF a Social Security number.

19 (2) A custodian shall permit inspection of the part of an application 20 described in paragraph (1)(I) of this subsection that contains a Social Security number
21 OR THE PART OF AN APPLICATION DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS
