17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (h) (1) (i) This subsection applies only in Carroll County.

4 (4) (iii) The Board may issue a Class BR beer, wine and liquor license to
5 an applicant who owns or operates a restaurant that:6 1. Serves at least one full-course evening dinner meal at
7 least [6] 5 days a week;

8 2. Is only open during the time meals are served;

9 3. Has a regular seating capacity at tables (not including
10 seating at bars and counters) for 50 or more people; and11 4. Is operated in facilities which are valued for purposes of
12 State and local assessment and taxation at not less than \$50,000.13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 June 1, 2005.
