SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning
- Transportation Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Metrorail Red Line Expansion and Dedicated Bus Lanes Study
- 4 FOR the purpose of requesting the Governor and the Secretary of Transportation to
- 5 urge the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority to conduct a certain
- 6 study of the expansion of Metrorail the Metrorail red line to Olney in
- 7 Montgomery County and the construction of a dedicated bus lane in a certain
- 8 <u>location in Montgomery County</u>; and urging the Governor to direct the Secretary
- 9 of Transportation to explore securing federal funds for the study of the
- 10 <u>expansion and for the expansion of the Metrorail red line and for the study of</u>
- the construction and for the construction of a dedicated bus lane.
- 12 WHEREAS, Traffic congestion in the Greater Washington region, and especially
- 13 in Montgomery County, is severe and has dramatically worsened in recent years; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Residents of the Greater Washington region have moved farther
- 15 from Washington, D.C., including Olney, Maryland; and
- WHEREAS, The Department of Transportation has indicated that periods
- 17 marked by severely congested conditions on the Capital Beltway, with associated
- 18 degradation to the air quality of the region, will expand from the current 5 hours per
- 19 day to over 14 hours per day by 2020; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Improved public transportation in the outer suburbs would
- 21 significantly reduce traffic congestion by providing a convenient and reliable transit
- 22 alternative for thousands of suburban commuters using the Capital Beltway; now,
- 23 therefore, be it

- 6 service to Olney, with at least one station at the intersection of Norbeck Road and
- 7 Route 97 (Georgia Avenue); and
- 8 (2) The construction of a dedicated bus lane in the median divider on
- 9 Route 97 (Georgia Avenue) to provide express bus service between the Glenmont
- 10 Metrorail station and Olney in Montgomery County; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly urges the Governor to direct the
- 12 Secretary of Transportation to explore securing federal funds for the study of the
- 13 expansion and for the expansion of the Metrorail red line and for the study of the
- 14 construction and for the construction of the dedicated bus lane on Route 97; and be it
