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6. Purpose of Bill

For the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$784,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the County Exective and County Council of Baltimore County (Grantee) for the planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction and capital equipping of the following athletic fields in Baltimore County: Fullerton Elementary School, Catonsville Park, Berkshire Elementary School and Hannah More Park

7. Matching Fund Requirements

Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the purposes set forth above, the Grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the Grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization

Baltimore County, Maryland is a jurisdiction containing approximately 640 square miles and a current population of approximately 754,252 people, averaging 1,179 people/square mile. The population is predicted to rise to 803,500 by 2025. The jurisdiction currently boasts over 900 recreational sites in its inventory, consisting of both active and passive recreational lands. Active recreational fields include approximately 386 athletic fields, 40 of which are lit, and over 560 ball diamonds, 33 of which are lit. The Department of Recreation and Parks is in the process of renovating all of its playgrounds, tennis and multi-purpose courts, and athletic field lighting as part of the County's vision of community renaissance.

10. Description and Purpose of Project

This project will enable Baltimore County to continue in its vision of revitalization and renaissance of its older communities. Many of the County recreational facilities were developed in the 1950's and 60's. Population of the County has grown tremendously since then, causing the fields to be over used. There has not been a consistent field renovation program in place to alleviate the effects of over use and many of the fields, especially those under lights, suffer from extreme compaction, rutting, grading and/or parking problems. The Department of Recreation and Parks has analyzed the condition of all of its play fields and put together a matrix which sets prioities for field renovations by weighting condition, use and other pertinent factors. This project will enable the Department of Recreation and Parks to implement a program using both in-house and on-call contractors to renovate athletic fields and ball diamonds and create an on-going maintenance program to insure they remain in good condition. Round all amounts to the nearest \$1,000. The totals in Items 11 (Estimated Capital Costs) and 12 (Proposed Funding Sources) must match. The proposed funding sources must not include the value of real property unless an equivalent value is shown under Estimated Capital Costs.
