6. Purpose of Bill

For the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$500,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the County Exective and County Council of Baltimore County (Grantee) for the planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of an expansion of the Marshy Point Nature Center building in Eastern Baltimore County. This facility is an used extensively by the Baltimore County Board of Education (10,000 fifth graders visited the site last year) to teach children about the fragile ecosytems that rely on and support the Chesapeake Bay. In total, over 26,000 people visited the center in fiscal 2004.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the purposes set forth above, the Grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the Grantee's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act.

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization

Baltimore County, Maryland is a jurisdiction containing approximately 640 square miles and a current population of approximately 754,252 people, averaging 1,179 people/square mile. The population is predicted to rise to 803,500 by 2025. The jurisdiction currently boasts over 900 recreational sites in its inventory, consisting of both active and passive recreational lands. The County has four environmental/educational centers: Marshy Point Nature Center, Cromwell Valley Park, Oregon Ridge Park Nature Center and Benjamen Banneker Center.

10. Description and Purpose of Project

This project will continue the development of the park by the completing the education and exhibit building as well as surrounding observation decks and other ancillary amenities.
