FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

Senate Bill 512

(Cecil County Senators)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Economic Matters

Cecil County - Alcoholic Beverages Licensees - Administrative Proceedings

This bill adds Cecil County to the list of counties in which the county board of license commissioners is authorized to proceed administratively against an alcoholic beverages licensee for selling or furnishing alcoholic beverages to an individual who is under 21 years old, even if the licensee had been granted probation before judgment.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2005.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The change is procedural in nature and would not directly affect Cecil County finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: In six counties the board of license commissioners may take administrative action against an alcoholic beverages licensee for selling or furnishing alcoholic beverages to an individual under 21 years old, even if the licensee had been granted probation before judgment. Those counties are Dorchester, Garrett, Howard, Kent, Montgomery, and St. Mary's.

Background: In fiscal 2004, there were five reported retail license violations in Cecil County. Of these, two were reported violations of a retail alcoholic beverages licensee selling alcoholic beverages to a minor.
