House Bill 1423 (Delegate McComas)

Health and Government Operations

### **Assisted Living Programs - Services and Facilities Search Engine**

This bill requires the Office of Health Care Quality (OHCQ) within the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) to develop a web page with a search engine that helps a consumer of assisted living services find an assisted living program in the State that meets the consumer's needs. OHCQ must model the search engine on the information provided in Appendix II of the Federal Government Accounting Office Report GAO-04-684. DHMH must adopt regulations to carry out the bill's provisions.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** DHMH general fund expenditures could increase by \$250,500 in FY 2006, which includes a one-time cost to design a database and web site. Future year estimates reflect annualization and inflation. No effect on revenues.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** None applicable.

**Background:** In April 2004, GAO issued a report on *Assisted Living, Examples of State Efforts to Improve Consumer Protections*. One concern identified in the report was the difficulty consumers had accessing adequate information on the availability and options for assisted living. The report cited Florida's "Find-a-Facility" consumer search as one way to enhance public access to information about assisted living. **Exhibit 1** illustrates the criteria by which an individual may search for assisted living facilities using Florida's search function.

**State Fiscal Effect:** OHCQ advises that expenditures could increase by \$617,305 in fiscal 2006 to design and implement a database and web application similar to the one used in Florida. Additionally, OHCQ would need to hire 10 positions, including four computer systems positions to manage the web site, one administrative specialist to manage the collection of data, two office secretaries to enter data, and three health facility surveyor nurses to collect additional data during surveys of 1,575 assisted living programs to provide the same type of searchable data as Florida's "Find-a-Facility" uses. *Legislative Services disagrees with this estimate*.

Legislative Services estimates that OHCQ general fund expenditures could increase by \$250,491, which accounts for the bill's October 1, 2005 effective date. It is assumed that data would be collected from current surveys, obviating the need for additional facility surveyor nurses. In addition, it is assumed that assisted living facilities would voluntarily submit additional data because they would benefit from being part of a public listing. Further, OHCQ would not be required to verify data but instead could issue a disclaimer, similar to Florida's, stating the search results are intended only to provide consumers with a starting point in locating a suitable facility and that it is the user's responsibility to verify the facility information and to ensure that the facility is in fact suitable for the prospective resident.

This estimate reflects a one-time \$122,015 cost for contractual staff to design the database and web site, including a design consultant, computer network specialist, and database specialist. It also reflects the cost of hiring one administrative officer to function as program manager and oversee data collection, one data entry operator to input data, and one part-time webmaster to maintain the system designed by consultants. It includes salaries, fringe benefits, one-time start-up costs, and ongoing operating expenses.

Future year expenditures reflect: (1) full salaries with 4.6% annual increases and 3% employee turnover; and (2) 1% annual increases in ongoing operating expenses.
