The Sara Hohne Patient Protection Act

This bill specifies hospital discharge procedures for patients. A hospital's process for transfer or discharge must be based on a patient's assessed needs. A hospital must: (1) assess a patient's needs; (2) plan for discharge or transfer; (3) facilitate the discharge or transfer process; (4) give the patient written discharge instructions; and (5) help to ensure that continuity of care, treatment, and services is maintained.

A hospital that fails to comply with these requirements is subject to a civil money penalty up to \$10,000 for each failure to comply. A hospital may appeal a penalty under the Administrative Procedure Act.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill would not materially affect governmental operations or finances. Any civil penalties imposed and collected are assumed to be minimal.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: If a hospital is able to provide adequate care to a patient, the hospital may not transfer the patient to another hospital unless specified requirements are met. There are no provisions governing a hospital or related institution discharging a patient to an assisted living facility.

Background: The bill adopts the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations (JCAHO) requirements regarding patient discharge or transfer from a hospital. JCAHO is the nationally-recognized accrediting organization that oversees the operations of hospitals nationwide. States generally defer to JCAHO requirements regarding hospital regulation.
