FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 124 (St. Mary's County Delegation) Health and Government Operations

Temporary Food Service Facility - License - Length of Operation

This bill alters the number of days a temporary food service facility may operate from not more than 14 consecutive days to not more than 120 days each year.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill would affect local government operations only.

Local Effect: To the extent that this bill increases the number of temporary food service facility licenses issued by local health departments (\$35 per license), revenues would increase. No effect on expenditures.

Small Business Effect: Significant for small businesses that could operate a temporary food service facility for a maximum of 120 days annually, instead of the existing limitation of 14 days.

Analysis

Current Law: A temporary food service facility operates for not more than 14 consecutive days at a fixed location in conjunction with a fair, carnival, public exhibition, construction project, recreational facility, or similar gathering. A temporary food service facility license expires at the end of the underlying event or after the 14 consecutive days of operation, whichever is earlier, or as provided by local law, ordinance, or regulation.

Background: In fiscal 2004, there were 8,383 temporary food service facility licenses issued in Maryland. **Exhibit 1** lists the licenses by region. A temporary food service facility pays a \$35 license fee to the appropriate local health department.
