House Bill 545

(Delegate Levy)

Massage Therapists - Certification and Registration - Educational Qualifications

This bill revises the Massage Therapy Advisory Committee's educational requirements for certified massage therapists and registered massage practitioners. An applicant can satisfy the educational requirement if the individual, on or after March 1, 2004, was enrolled in a board-approved school and graduated from that school no later than December 31, 2004.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill's requirements could be handled with existing budgeted resources.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Certified massage therapists and registered massage practitioners are regulated by the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners' Massage Therapy Advisory Committee.

A certificate applicant must satisfactorily complete at least 60 credit hours of education at an institution of higher education approved by the board and the Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC). An applicant also must complete 500 hours of education in a board-approved program for the study of massage therapy that includes specified content.

A registration applicant must complete 500 hours of education in a board-approved program for the study of massage therapy that includes specified content.

Background: There are 2,167 active certified massage therapists and 216 active registered massage practitioners in Maryland.
