## FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE Revised

House Bill 1236 Ways and Means (Delegate Heller, et al.)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

#### **Community College Students with Disabilities Task Force**

This bill establishes the Community College Students with Disabilities Task Force. The task force must identify strategies to improve educational and employment outcomes for community college students with disabilities and develop recommendations to enable community colleges to acquire the resources needed to serve students with disabilities. A final report is due December 1, 2005. The Maryland Higher Education Commission, State Department of Disabilities, and Maryland Association of Community Colleges must provide staff for the task force.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2005 and terminates June 30, 2006.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** The assigned State agencies could provide staff for the task force with existing personnel and resources. Any expense reimbursements for State officials appointed to the task force could be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.

**Local Effect:** Community college representatives appointed to the task force could be reimbursed for any travel expenses from existing budgeted resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

### Analysis

**Background:** There are approximately 12,300 students with disabilities attending public elementary and secondary schools in Maryland. It is not known how many attend

community colleges in the State. A study conducted for the Commission on Education Finance, Equity, and Excellence in 2001 concluded that, on average, the cost to educate an elementary or secondary student with a disability is equal to 217% of the cost to educate a nondisabled student.
