FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE Revised

Senate Bill 316 Finance (Senator Klausmeier)

Health and Government Operations

Health Insurance - Pharmacies - Electronic Reimbursement

This bill requires a health insurer, nonprofit health service plan, or HMO (carrier) that provides prescription drug coverage and requires a pharmacy to submit a request for payment electronically to reimburse that pharmacy electronically at the pharmacy's request.

The bill takes effect October 1, 2006.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill pertains exclusively to private sector activities.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal. Electronic reimbursement could reduce small business pharmacy administrative costs.

Analysis

Current Law: The Medicaid program is required to reimburse a pharmacy electronically, upon request, if Medicaid requires the pharmacy to submit its request for reimbursement electronically.

Background: HB 512 of 2004, an identical bill, was referred to interim study last session and the Health and Government Operations' Insurance Subcommittee held a

briefing on November 9, 2004 to hear from the pharmacy industry and payors. Opinions on the feasibility of requiring electronic reimbursement varied.
