## FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 1447 Ways and Means (Washington County Delegation)

**Budget and Taxation** 

### Washington County - Hotel Rental Tax Revenue - Distribution

This bill increases from 45% to 50% the amount of hotel tax revenue that Washington County must provide for funding of the Hagerstown/Washington County Convention and Visitors Bureau.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2005.

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** The bill does not change the total Washington County hotel tax revenues but changes the distribution of those revenues. It increases by 5%, or approximately \$60,000, the amount annually distributed to the Hagerstown/Washington County Convention and Visitors Bureau and decreases by 5% the amount distributed to a special fund used to promote tourism, economic development, and recreation projects in the county.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** Washington County must distribute 45% of its total hotel tax revenue for the Hagerstown/Washington County Convention and Visitors Bureau and the remaining amount is distributed to a special fund used to cover the costs of administering the hotel

tax, develop tourism attractions, enhance economic development, and support cultural and recreation projects in the county.

Background: Washington County imposes a 6% hotel tax in fiscal 2005.
