6. Purpose of Bill

Authorizing the creation of a State debt, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Mayor and City Council of the City of Boonsboro for the construction of King Farm Park, including a pavilion, ball fields, a pedestrian bridge, and a concession stand, located in Boonsboro.

7. Matching Fund Requirements

Prior to the payment of any funds, the grantee shall provide and expend a matching fund. No part of the fund may consist of real property or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. The fund may consist of in kind contributions.

8. Special Provisions

None

9. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization

The Mayor and Council of Boonsboro is a governmental body responsible for establishing provisions applicable to the public health, safety and welfare of the town's 3,000 plus residents.

10. Description and Purpose of Project

The Town of Boonsboro successfully acquired 35.48 acres of land contiguous to Shafer Park located along MD Route 34 in Boonsboro, Maryland with annual acquisition funding provided through Program Open Space. Boonsboro staff has compiled data formed from public input and informational meetings to prepare a Master Plan for the expansion/development of Shafer Park to accommodate the recreational needs and accelerated growth in southern Washington County. In order to feasibly fund and construct a project of this magnitude, it has been divided into three phases, some including sub-phases that will consist of a little league size baseball field, a full size soccer field, bleachers, parking areas, paved entrance and deceleration lane from Route 34, 4 pavilions, a gazebo, pedestrian bridge, soccer/football field, fishing pond, enclosed aquatic center, new library, walking trails, dog park, tot lot, two (2) restroom facilities and one (1) concession stand. The additional library phase will consist of the building structure, parking lot and a storm water management facility will be constructed as separate funding becomes available and it may be constructed simultaneously with another phase. The MD National Guard will provide grading assistance under the Innovative Readiness Construction Assistance Program and the Mayor and Council just committed to a \$2 million-dollar loan that will allow this vital project to begin. Funding is being requested to assist in the construction of the fishing pond and the storm water management pond area once the MD National Guard has completed the initial grading to allow immediate use for the town's annual fishing derby.
