AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 763

(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, strike beginning with "establishing" in line 3 down through the second "Fund; "in line 7.

On page 2, in line 2, after "record" insert "or if the individual has been convicted of certain alcohol- or drug-related offenses"; strike beginning with "altering" in line 12 down through "penalty;" in line 14; strike beginning with the first "providing" in line 15 down through "Act;" in line 16; strike beginning with "2-801" in line 20 down through "and" in line 21; and in line 37, strike "and 17-106(e)".

On page 3, strike in their entirety lines 5 through 10, inclusive.

On page 10, strike in their entirety lines 5 and 6.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 3 through 6, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 13 on page 3 th rough line 36 on page 6, inclusive.

On pages 13 through 15, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 11 on page 1 3 through line 27 on page 15, inclusive.

AMENDMENT NO. 3

On page 11, strike in their entirety lines 31 through 35, inclusive, and substitute:

"(A)

THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ASSESS THE FOLLOWING FEES AGAINST A LI CENSEE HOLDING A NONCOMMERCIAL CLASS A, B, C, D, E, OR M DRIVER'S LICEN <u>(1)</u>

IF THE LICENSEE HAS ACCUMULATED MORE THAN 5 POINTS ON THE LICEN SEE'S DRIVING RECORD, EXCLUDING POINTS ACCUMULATED FOR A CONVICTION UNDER § 21-902 OF THIS ARTICLE, FOR EACH POINT THAT THE LICENSEE ACCUMULATES OVER 5 POINTS, A FEE OF \$50 ANNUALLY FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS FROM THE DATE THAT THE POINT WAS ASSESSED; AND

(2)

FOR EACH TIME A LICENSEE IS CONVICTED FOR A VIOLATION OF § 21-902 OF THIS ARTICLE, OR AN OFFENSE IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION THAT WOULD BE A VIOLATION OF § 21-902 OF THIS ARTICLE IF COMMITTED IN THIS STATE, A FEE OF \$300 ANNUALLY FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS FROM THE DATE OF CONVICTION."

AMENDMENT NO. 4

On page 15, after line 27, insert:

"SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect Octobe r 1, 2006.".
